Children's Chapel Procession

The First Lesson.....Acts 9:1-6

Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked him for letters to the synagogues at Damascus, so that if he found any who belonged to the Way, men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem. Now as he was going along and approaching Damascus, suddenly a light from heaven flashed around him. He fell to the ground and heard a voice saying to him, "Saul, Saul, why do you persecute me?" He asked, "Who are you, Lord?" The reply came, "I am Jesus, whom you are persecuting. But get up and enter the city, and you will be told what you are to do."

The Second Lesson.....Revelation 5:11-14

I looked, and I heard the voice of many angels surrounding the throne and the living creatures and the elders; they numbered myriads of myriads and thousands of thousands, singing with full voice, "Worthy is the Lamb that was slaughtered to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!" Then I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, singing, "To the one seated on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!" And the four living creatures said, "Amen!" And the elders fell down and worshiped.

The Gospel.....John 21:1-19

Jesus showed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias; and he showed himself in this way. Gathered there together were Simon Peter, Thomas called the Twin, Nathanael of Cana in Galilee, the sons of Zebedee, and two others of his disciples. Simon Peter said to them, "I am going fishing." They said to him, "We will go with you." They went out and got into the boat, but that night they caught nothing. Just after daybreak, Jesus stood on the beach; but the disciples did not know that it was Jesus. Jesus said to them, "Children, you have no fish, have you?" They answered him, "No." He said to them, "Cast the net to the right side of the boat, and you will find some." So they cast it, and now they were not able to haul it in because there were so many fish. That disciple whom Jesus loved said to Peter, "It is the Lord!" When Simon Peter heard that it was the Lord, he put on some clothes, for he was naked, and jumped into the sea. But the other disciples came in the boat, dragging the net full of fish, for they were not far from the land, only about a hundred yards off. When they had gone ashore, they saw a charcoal fire there, with fish on it, and bread. Jesus said to them, "Bring some of the fish that you have just caught." So Simon Peter went aboard and hauled the net ashore, full of large fish, a hundred fifty-three of them; and though there were so many, the net was not torn. Jesus said to them, "Come and have breakfast." Now none of the disciples dared to ask him, "Who are you?" because they knew it was the Lord. Jesus came and took the bread and gave it to them, and did the same with the fish. This was now the third time that Jesus appeared to the disciples after he was raised from the dead. When they had finished breakfast, Jesus said to Simon Peter, "Simon son of John, do you love me more than these?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my lambs." A second time he

said to him, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" He said to him, "Yes, Lord; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Tend my sheep." He said to him the third time, "Simon son of John, do you love me?" Peter felt hurt because he said to him the third time, "Do you love me?" And he said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." Jesus said to him, "Feed my sheep. Very truly, I tell you, when you were younger, you used to fasten your own belt and to go wherever you wished. But when you grow old, you will stretch out your hands, and someone else will fasten a belt around you and take you where you do not wish to go." (He said this to indicate the kind of death by which he would glorify God.) After this he said to him, "Follow me."

Helpful Hints for Earth Day 2010

HOME

Recycle according to your municipal regulations; contact your City Hall for information as needed.

Recycle batteries and compact fluorescent light bulbs at home improvement/hardware stores.

Recycle computer printer ribbons at office supply stores, or some schools/charitable organizations collect them.

Use cloth towels instead of paper. If you use paper products, choose recycled paper if possible.

Use lunch boxes instead of bags and reusable containers that do not contain BPA (see article <http://www.jsonline.com/news/milwaukee/87467547.html>), or wax bags (they decompose much faster than plastic). If you use plastic for garbage collection, consider decomposable bags found at Whole Foods, Outpost or other cooperatives.

Eat organic, hormone and antibiotic-free food.

Consider joining a co-op or a CSA farm (community supported agriculture) which will deliver fresh, organic produce through the growing season.

Avoid foods with pesticides, antibiotics or hormones added to increase production.

Plant an organic vegetable garden and you will know where your food is coming from and save money on food costs.

Lights out! Unplug small appliances not in use.

Consider installing a whole house "off switch" to turn off all power except to those things which need to remain on for safety or efficiency.

Heat down! Turn down the thermostat, wear additional layers as needed. This lowers costs and the risk of illness.

Heat down! Turn down the temperature of your water heater. Save money in heating the water and reduce the incidence of scalding.

Consider installing an instant-heat hot water heater which only heats water as needed.

Run appliances in the early morning or late evening.

Wash dishes/clothes on days when it isn't raining heavily, when the deep tunnels can better accommodate the water volume, and less untreated water runs into our rivers and lakes.

Cool up! Raise the air conditioner temperature. Install ceiling fans and change their rotation so they run clockwise in winter, counter-clockwise in summer.
Use a rain barrel(s) for water collection to water gardens.
Purchase Energy Star appliances.
Contact WE Energies to purchase “clean” energy in the course of paying utility bills.
Consider solar panels: Milwaukee Shines is a grant-funded program for panel installation.

TRANSPORTATION

Carpool, walk or ride the bus.
Consider hybrid vehicles if you drive.
Do not let your car engine idle if you will be stopped for longer than 10 to 30 seconds. New cars will not be worn out by additional starts.
Drive the speed limit to save gas.

COMMUNITY

Participate in your local Earth Day clean up activities.
Help beautify a local park, school or public right of way.
Challenge neighbors to join you in “greening” your homes and neighborhood.
Join a Green Neighbor program or join a church group to work together on lowering your family carbon foot print. The "5000 Carbon Diet" will be available at Trinity upon request.

WORK

Minimize power usage.
Minimize the printing of documents.
Use recycled paper.
Recycle printer cartridges, paper and as much refuse as possible.

CHURCH

Walk or bike to church if you can.
Request an energy audit from the local power company to find where energy consumption can be reduced.
Install Energy Star appliances in kitchens.
Use recyclable products in hospitality and administrative areas.
Avoid pesticide use in care of the grounds, and install rain barrels to water gardens.
Teach care of the earth as stewardship of God’s creation.
